GLYN DAVID RHYS-WILLIAMS

A young man's bravery in North Africa

Glyn came from a notable Glamorganshire family whose home was in Miskin Manor, not far from Police Headquarters.

His grandfather was a judge. His father was also a lawyer and a Member of Parliament, whilst his mother too was active in politics. In the days before the welfare state, she did much to promote maternity services and child welfare.

Glyn, like his father before him, was a pupil at Eton College and in 1939 he became a Special Constable in the Glamorgan Police, serving at the force's headquarters in Cardiff.

After the outbreak of the Second World War, he enlisted in the Welch Regiment as a private soldier but soon became an officer in the Welsh Guards, in which his father had served with distinction during the First World War.

Glyn was eventually promoted to the rank of captain in the 3rd Battalion which in 1943 was in action against German forces in Tunisia.

On 9th April, the Battalion had to attack high ground overlooking the Fondouk Pass. It was a difficult struggle and the Battalion suffered many casualties before success was eventually achieved.

Key to that success was Glyn's inspirational leadership and bravery. Sadly, as he was leading the final assault, he was shot and killed by a sniper.

The history of the Welsh Guards in the Second World War described his contribution in this way:

“So he died, giving his life to ensure a victory which already owed so much to his quick understanding of what was needed, his unhesitating acceptance of responsibility, and his selfless devotion to duty.”

His actions that day led to his commanding officer recommending that he be awarded the Victoria Cross. Unfortunately, this did not materialise although he was Mentioned in Despatches.

Glyn was twenty-one years of age when he died.

He is buried at the Commonwealth war cemetery at Enfidaville in Tunisia. The headstone to his grave contains the inscription:

“Blessed are the pure in heart for they shall see God.”

Nearer home, in St. David's Church, Miskin, there are a plaque and stained-glass window in his memory.

His name also appears on the Glamorgan Police War Memorial here at Police Headquarters where today South Wales Police remembers him and his bravery with pride.
